I AM UNCONQUERED ACTIVITES

In 1875, English poet William Ernest Henley wrote *Invictus*, a poem that has long served as inspiration for those facing adversity or challenges in their lives. The word Invictus means "unconquered".

I AM is the motto for the Invictus Games and is inspired by the last two lines of *Invictus*: "I am the master of my fate: I am the captain of my soul." "I AM" reflects and defines the Invictus Games' core purpose: to provide a platform for personal achievement, to compete not just against each other, but against oneself.

The Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025 will bring together over 500 wounded, injured, and sick military service members and Veterans from around the world on a courageous journey of recovery through the healing power of sport. Their inspiration comes directly from "I AM Unconquered."

Objective

Students will be able to:

- learn about the Invictus Games and gain an understanding about the meaning of Invictus
- explore their I AMs through multiple activities
- develop vocabulary related to the Games that is useful elsewhere in their lives

Target audience

These activities are suitable for grades K-5. The content of this lesson plan is suited for Language Arts, Fine Arts and Physical & Health Education. Activities can be modified to fit available time or can be stretched out over multiple days.



TEACHER NOTES

Introduce the Invictus Games

- Introduce the Invictus Games by watching "Welcome to the Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025" video on Elementary School main page under Additional Resources (2.45) <u>https://youtu.be/X53KCVjf8_k</u> and/or reading the introduction on the next page. Written introduction features opportunities for questions and discussion.
- 2. View the Gallery of Heroes PPT images on Additional Resources to provide a sense of what these Games look like.
- 3. Use a chart board, black board, or white board to record responses as you discuss what the students see or notice in the images.
- 4. View the video <u>I AM Invictus | #ShareYourIAM (youtube.com</u>) (1:52 mins) (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=kCgEViA3TxI). Have students think of a word for themselves. You can write these on the board and then they make their own boards using the downloadable template. Students can present to the class and explain why they chose their I AM. Encourage other languages or even art as expression.
- 5. Word Searches depending on level of students see the Word Search worksheets
 - a. option to complete as a class; when someone finds a word everyone uses it in a sentence either verbal or written
 - b. option to work in pairs and use each word in a sentence after it is found
 - c. challenge to change words into new words i.e. "fun" becomes "funny"
 - d. integrate math by counting the number of letters in each word
- 6. Acrostic Poems use the worksheets provided or have students create their own acrostic poem using the word they chose for their "I AM"; can decorate with artwork, coloured paper, sparkles & other art items.
- 7. Cloze Activity after watching the introductory video and reading the class the introduction, complete the cloze activity in small groups or as a class to continue building on vocabulary.
- 8. Trivia use this activity as a way to learn more about the Invictus Games.

INTRODUCTION TO THE INVICTUS GAMES

The Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025 are coming February 8-16, 2025, bringing over 500 competitors from up to 25 different nations. A Veteran is someone who has served in the military and is no longer doing so.

[Question opportunity: Does anyone in the classroom have a connection to the military? Do they want to share?]

The Games are important for these wounded, injured, and sick service members and Veterans from around the world as a way for them to heal through the power of sport. They are on a courageous journey of recovery that they share with their family and friends. Each competitor will be allowed to bring two family or friends with them to the Invictus Games for support.


[Discussion opportunity about friends and family and support networks to help people get through life's struggles.]

The Invictus Games Vancouver Whistler 2025 marks the first time winter sports will be included in the Invictus Games, making it the first-ever winter hybrid Games.

The new winter sports are alpine Skiing and Snowboarding, Nordic Skiing, Biathlon, Skeleton, and Wheelchair Curling.

The traditional Invictus Games sports they will compete in are Sitting Volleyball, Wheelchair Basketball, Wheelchair Rugby, Indoor Rowing, and Swimming. All of these sports are adaptive, which allows for everyone to participate.

[Discussion opportunity about adaptive sport, some of the equipment and how that promotes inclusivity. Ask students to share their favourite sport/activity or hobby and explore how it can be adapted to be more inclusive.]

Sport/Hobby Discussion

- View the video <u>I AM Invictus | #ShareYourIAM (youtube.com)</u> (1:52 mins)
- Have the class name things they like to do a hobby or a sport, teacher writes student responses on one page of the chart paper or one side of blackboard
- On another page/side, have students say how they feel when they are doing their hobby/sport and record their responses

Brainstorm and Share Your I AM

- 1. I AM activity downloadable/printable page or students create their own page
- 2. Have students present their I AM and share what it means to them
- 3. Create a class word cloud based on students' I AM word

[Discuss the vocabulary and their definitions. Can describe how they relate to the Games and how they can be used in life in general. Guided practice - divide students into small groups for activities.]

Invictus Games Word Search Activity

- Teachers can create their own word search with preferred vocabulary or can select from the prepared worksheets on the Elementary School main page
- Options for learning laid out in Teacher Notes section

Acrostic Poem Activity

- Explain that an acrostic poem is a type of poem where the first letter of each line spells out a word; sample worksheets on the Elementary School main page
- In this example, the poem features the word "inspired", and each line of the poem will start with the letters of the word "inspired"
- Model the activity with another word, e.g. "Inspired" Assign each group a different word from the vocabulary to create an acrostic poem. Or, have each group do their own take on an acrostic poem using "Invictus"

Sample Acrostic Poem: Imagine new things, Never stop dreaming, So much to see, Play and create, Ideas will grow, Realize your dreams, Every day's bright, Dream big and shine.

• Once students do their I AM, they could also create their own acrostic poem based on their word
